West Fannin Elementary School Wins TVA STEM Grant

West Fannin Elementary School has been awarded a grant from the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), in partnership with Bicentennial Volunteers Inc. (BVI), a TVA retiree organization, to develop science, technology, engineering and math education projects to help spark student interest in future careers in STEM-related fields.

Teachers across TVA's seven-state region applied for funding of up to \$5,000 for projects, and 238 applications were selected.

"We are excited to have this funding to support hands-on activities and programs that help students develop skills that can apply to realworld problem-solving," says Alison Danner, Principal of West Fannin Elementary. "We want to open doors to high-quality, rewarding jobs for our students, and the grant will help us introduce them to these subjects from a young age."

Schools that are awarded grants must receive their power from a local power company served by TVA. West Fannin Elementary is served by Tri-State EMC.

"It's inspiring to be able to contribute to the innovators of the next generation."
